# Freight & Salvage Coffeehouse New Home Project

The Freight & Salvage, the longest-running full-time folk music venue west of the Mississippi, is building a spacious new green performance facility at 2020 Addison Street in the vital and developing Downtown Arts District in Berkeley. With the generous support of the City of Berkeley, the State of California, foundations, corporations, and lovers of folk and traditional music, the Freight is creating one of the premier folk performance venues in the country. The new green building also includes classroom space, allowing the Freight to expand its educational offerings and to bring music into the local schools. The Freight, celebrating its 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2008, remains committed to presenting the best in folk and traditional music in an intimate, family-friendly, all-ages environment. The new building is scheduled to open in early 2009.
