Freight & Salvage Coffeehouse Named Best Small Venue at 2008 Folk Alliance Awards

BERKELEY, Calif., March 3, 2008 – The Freight & Salvage Coffeehouse, the longest-established full-time folk and traditional music venue west of the Mississippi River, won the Folk Alliance Award for "Best Small Venue" in North America at the 20th annual International Folk Alliance Conference Feb. 20 in Memphis. The Freight tied for the award with Caffé Lena in Saratoga Springs, New York. The annual awards are given by the North American Folk Music and Dance Alliance

The awards were presented in a ceremony featuring former Attorney General Janet Reno, who produced a 2007 recording of traditional music by contemporary artists called <u>Song of America</u>, and performances by Kathy Mattea, Tom Russell, Eilen Jewell, Twilight Hotel, and Anthony DaCosta. The ceremony was broadcast live on XM Radio.

The Freight & Salvage has just begun renovation of a 70-year-old building in Berkeley's Downtown Arts District, transforming it into its new, 18,000-square-foot green performing arts and teaching facility. The nonprofit organization's <u>new home</u> at 2020 Addison Street, slated to open in early 2009, will have a 440-seat listening room, double the capacity of its existing venue. The plans also include an additional performance space seating 60-70 people, a state-of-the-art sound system, a café, and six classrooms.
